Interest in the churches being built in Vietnam is growing here in the U.S.! America has always led the way in missionary endeavors around the world and many are responding to the new opportunities we are seeing in Vietnam. We have an incredible opportunity right now because the government has begun allowing more freedom of religion.

Mission Vietnam is trying to take advantage of this window of opportunity as quickly as possible.

In particular, I would like to spotlight three particular

examples of the type of opportunities we are seeing. These are the stories of just three of the many churches that are ready to build and how their struggle is unfolding.

•The Binh Cat church located in the town of Binh Cach in the Tien Giang Province--This church's original building was bulldozed down one night two years ago—without the church's knowledge—and the land claimed by the communist government for a Red Cross building. This was done to try to make it impossible for the

church to continue. However, the believers of this church were able to raise \$5,000 to purchase some land, but still need another \$25,000 to build the church. These are very poor people. The church needs to be built within 3 months or they will have to apply for a building permit all over again. We call this the "bulldozed church."

- *The My Phuoc church is also in Tien Giang Province. The land for this church has been donated by one of the believers. The money to build the church was borrowed. To complete the church and repay the borrowed money the church needs \$15,000. There are currently 60-70 believers attending services, with a total of about 200 believers in the area. This church would provide a meeting place for all the believers. Most of the believers work at a clothing factory very close to the church. Again, the government is requiring them to finish the church and provide a pastor and worshippers before they can have final approval as a church. I have included a picture of the church as it was 3 weeks ago.
- The third church is the Moriah church in the town of Da Don, in the Province of Lam Dong. This is a church that serves the ethnic people of

the area. The Christians of this church were able to raise \$3,000. Considering how poor these people are, this was hard earned money and required many sacrifices. Some of these people are so poor, all they could provide were vegetables from their garden to be sold, but they wanted to be able to be part of the project. A Mission Vietnam donor has already sent \$5,000 and \$8,000 will finish the project! When completed, the church will seat 70 people and be used for Sunday services, Bible studies, prayer meetings, conferences, and training courses. While in Vietnam, we personally met this pastor and heard his story concerning the difficulty they are having finishing their church due to the government's continual efforts to find ways to stop them. However, God is faithful and they are making progress.
