The little Vietnamese children we had come to see filed in and formed a small chair at the front of the chapel. Standing there nervously back and forth, as they waited for the service to begin. They were all dressed in their Sunday best. It was beautiful how every family even if the words were not, was. It was beautiful the way their voices blended together as they sang the old hymn, Amazing Grace, in their own language. The Holy Spirit seemed to settle over the little chapel and its worshippers—hovering like the heavy fog that settles over the mountaintops of the surrounding hills.
