
Right now we could legally build as many as 200 churches, hold more Easter and Christmas crusades, and add more students to our Christian orphanage.

Christmas Crusade was a great success!

In two nights over 20,000 people gathered in a soccer stadium in the largest city in Vietnam—Saigon. Greg Bostock reports that he was invited to sing O Holy Night and a song of his own, "Light of the World." Greg writes, "As I was singing Light of the World, over 5000 cell phones were waving like candles. It was breathtaking!" Over 1390 souls made a decision for Jesus in those two nights, seeds were planted in over 20 thousand and who knows how many heard the message blocks away. Greg tells us that it started to rain softly before the altar service, but then stopped. One Vietnamese man commented, "I think God was crying from all the souls coming to Him."
