Memories from Journey 2010 - Karen Perkins

"One of the most vivid memories I have of Vietnam isn't anything for which I can produce a photograph. It happened too quickly to be captured on film, but it will forever be etched in my mind's eye and on my heart.

We had gone to a ceremony to see some of the Vietnamese people receiving bicycles that were being given away by Mission Vietnam. There was a North Vietnamese veteran who was mingling with the journey team and introducing himself to the American veterans who had made the trip. He explained that he had been converted to Christianity a number of years ago and now spends his time sharing the gospel all over Vietnam and witnessing to many of his former comrades.

There was a reference made as to how sworn enemies from the past could now join together as friends. The man raised his hand heavenward and punched at the

air to indicate that this could only be accomplished through the love that God grows in the heart of man when he accepts Christ as Savior.

The meaning of his hand thrust skyward was lost on some because many of his fingers had been damaged in combat and he was missing part of his index or "pointing" finger. One of our veterans, realizing the concept that the man was attempting to convey, caught the back of the North Vietnamese veteran's hand and pulled this man's arm straight up in the air. With hands intertwined, our veteran used his OWN index finger to complete the gesture.

So in the end, the picture that one was left with, was that of a North Vietnamese veteran's arm superimposed on an American veteran's arm, two contrasting limbs once joined in physical altercation now united in spiritual battle, to bring honor and glory to our Lord. It was a very powerful image and as I stood there taking it in, I remember thinking, "Now THAT is victory!"
